Life-changing moment for skilled elite from Errigal

Two Drylining apprentices from Errigal are setting out on the Road to Shanghai following their selection to Squad UK for the international WorldSkills Competition.

Brendan Duddy, 20years old from Derry, and Kalem Kerrigan, 20 years old from Enniskillen were invited to join the prestigious WorldSkills UK Talent Development Programme after excelling in its national skills competitions, winning Gold and Silver, the finals of which were held last month at WorldSkills UK LIVE at the NEC in Birmingham.

The WorldSkills Competition, which will next be held in Shanghai, China in 2021, takes place every two years and is known as the 'Skills Olympics'. The competition will feature over 1000 of the world's most talented apprentices and students competing in over 50 different skills as they battle it out to be named the World Champion in their chosen skill.
