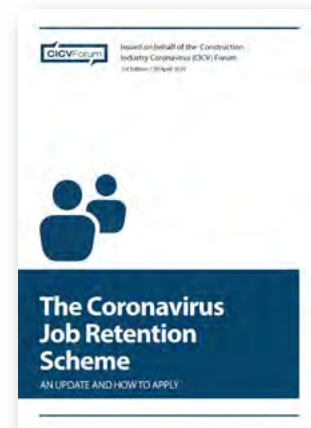
Recommended operating procedures for contractors

An overview of the potential impact of site closures during the COVID-19 pandemic, plus a step-by-step guide on how to apply for the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme.



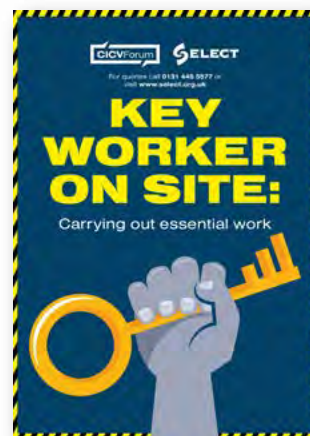
Essential guidance for the restart and return to work

A public-facing infographic explaining what constitutes 'essential work', plus on-site posters and stickers for contractors and customers to ensure work can be performed without unwanted interruption.



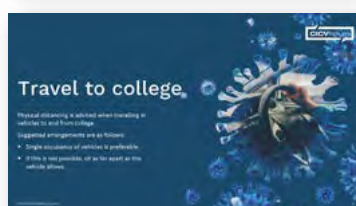
Open source signage to download and display

A public-facing animation, outlining the ongoing measures that workers on-site and in depots and offices can take after restart to protect themselves and each other.



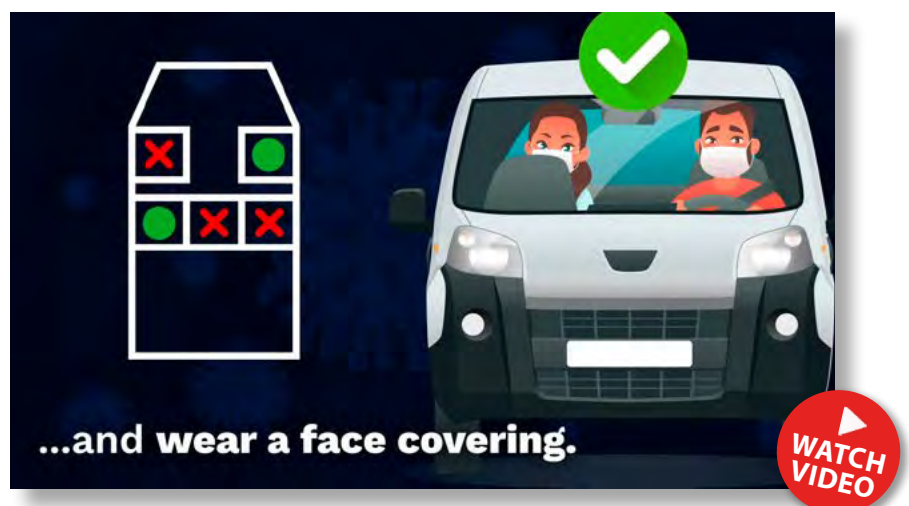
Helping contractors and occupiers stay safe
