

3. Complete the initial registration page and click 'Continue'. You will also need to tick the box to confirm you are not a robot.

Note: You will need to use your full name as it appears on your identification documents.




4. Complete all the sections on the next registration page. Fields with red stars are required. If you are a member for a professional institution you can list them. You


can also select your activity preferences for example, the types of activities you would like to take part in, or age groups you'd like to work with. By completing the 'My Activity Preference field' the system will automatically show you activities it thinks you would be suitable for once you are an approved ambassador

Note: To register as a STEM Ambassador, we will need to carry out a Disclosure and Barring Service check (DBS) which requires a gender to be disclosed. While we recognise that gender is not limited to male or female, the system currently only accepts these options in order for the DBS to be processed.

You can identify yourself as an Ambassador to your employer by adding your organisation and location. You should also tick the box to say you are happy to have your details shared with your employer. Don't worry, you can change this at any time. We will only share your name, email address, number of volunteering hours and account status (e.g. where you are up to in the process of becoming an ambassador). We may also share the date of your next activity if your employer asks for this.



You can also add any professional institutions that you are a member of. Again, you should also tick the box to say you are happy to have your details shared with your professional institution. Don't worry, you can change this at any time. We will only share your name, email address, number of volunteering hours and account status (e.g. where you are up to in the process of becoming an ambassador). We may also share the date of your next activity if your professional institution asks for this.



5. After you have submitted your registration form. You will receive an email from STEM learning letting you know the next steps. You may also receive an email from them asking you to verify your email address. Within 5 working days you will also receive an email from the STEM team at hub Transpennine. This will contain further information about how to complete your DBS check and online induction.
